

The partners discussed sustainability of the TILE project, its future and possibilities of cooperation between the partners after the TILE project formally ends.

The partners agreed on the following:

- 1) As the cooperation between partners during the TILE project has been very successful and they managed to develop very strong academic relations, institutional networks and common scientific aims, they all agreed to work towards future cooperation in research and development projects
- 2) Partners from the Czech Republic (Masaryk University) will be the coordinating party. They will manage preparation activities, which shall lead to common project application within the EU Framework Programme for Research and Innovation - Horizon 2020 in 2014. The topic of the project should further develop the ideas of TILE, however, it shall focus on the success of students with special needs at the labor market
- 3) Concerning the sustainability of the TILE project, partner agreed to keep the webpage with the final Roadmap in operation after the project ends as long as the institutional support from one of the partners permits. The website should be interactive and users of the Roadmap will have opportunity to share their opinions and experiences with the application of the Roadmap. In this way partners will have a chance to develop the Roadmap further according to the needs of different VET institutions.
- 4) 12 months after the end of the TILE project common videoconference will be held and the usage and possible amendments to the Roadmap will be discussed
- 5) Within further development of the Roadmap and assessment of its usage and effects, other partners (VET college and universities) from European countries shall be invited
- 6) Publication on the Roadmap development will be published with the data gathered from VET institutions using the Roadmap
- 7) Research on the development of understanding inclusion and exclusion within the project partners and countries will be realized by the Finnish partners
- 8) Partners from universities also agreed on development of common module within their courses, which will use knowledge generated by the TILE project. Students from the four universities involved should be able to collaborate together and use the Roadmap as the common ground for their work.

- 9) The Roadmap will also be used by the partners as a research tool. The topics of the collaborative research will focus on attitudes of teachers towards inclusion and the possibilities of attitude change.
